Ministry of Labour and Employment took the lead to observe World Day against child Labour 2012 in collaboration with ILO, Trade Unions, UNICEF, Save the Children in Bangladesh, Manusher Jonno Foundation and Bangladesh Shishu Adhikar Forum under the theme Human Rights and Social Justice... Let's End Child Labour. Events and activities organized to observe the day included: Joint Press Conference, National Seminar, awareness raising message through mobile phone operators and posters. Joint Press Conference

Press Conference: A joint press conference held at the national press club on 11 June to inform the people at large through media regarding various programmes strategies that are undertaken by the Government and private sector development agencies to address child labour. In the press conference, Joint Secretary (Labour) Ministry of Labour and Employment read out the message of the Honourable Prime Minister, Government of the Peoples' Republic of Bangladesh. A joint press briefing was read out by the Acting Secretary, Ministry of Labour and Employment. The ILO Director



read out the Global Press Release on WDACL 2012. The press briefing was followed by a question and answer session.

All major newspapers and television channels published and broadcasted news highlighting the key elements of the message from the ILO and the joint press briefing.

Art Competition for the Working Children



National Coordination Committee for Workers Education (NCCWE) with the support of the ILO observed the WDACL 2012 in a befitting manner. NCCWE has chalked out some Programme for working children and their parents. As part of the Programme, an art completion was organized by the NCCWE for the working children on 8th June 2012 at National Fine Arts Institute Campus of Dhaka University. A total of 50 working children participated in the competition. Eminent artist and sculptor Mr. Hamiduzzaman Khan Mr. Mujibur Rahman Bhuiyan, Secretary General, NCCWE inaugurated the event. At the end of the

competition, judges selected 30 best arts for exhibiting the pictures in different events on the occasion of WDACL 2012. Mr. Gagan Rajbhandhari Deputy Director of ILO Country Office for Bangladesh distributed prizes among the children.
