

Sector-based *actions* for adaptation to CC in the Blue Pacific Big Ocean States (BOS)

- Agriculture diversification: growing cabbage (Nassau Island in Cook I); growing taro in dry areas (Palau)
- *Green Tourism Financing*: Pristine Paradise Environmental Fee (Palau)
- Waste Management Climate Proofing: Solid waste management project in 9 Blue Ocean BOS
- Targeting 100% Renewable Energy by 2020: promoting solar mini-grids in rural communities (Fiji, Kiribati, Nauru, Tonga, Tuvalu and Vanuatu)
- Preserving Fisheries Stock: ban on commercial fishing (Palau)


JT & DW scenarios in the Blue Pacific BOS

Key Industries in the BOS	Just Transition Scenarios
Industries with expected net employment losses	
Mining	Operations likely to decline
Forestry/logging	Transitioning to sustainable logging
Established industries with expected new & redefined Jobs	
Agriculture	Sustainable and organic farming
Fisheries	18,000 new jobs next 10 years
Tourism	1.9 million live shark value (Palau)
Emerging and growing industries	
Construction/CC infrastructure	Green jobs creation for CC proofing
Renewable energy	Local maintenance & disposal jobs
Waste management	Circular economy business models

Emerging Strategies for Climate Resilience

- Design actions for local job creation in all donor-funded projects
- 2. Develop business engagement pathways for *green* industry involvement in TVET curriculum development
- 3. Measure progress on just transition sector plans
- 4. Consider *Green Jobs Act* related legislation
- Prioritize skills development of local talent in donorfunding projects.
