- Unemployment is a core social policy problem but no consensus on solutions.
- Recently, job guarantee proposals received attention but evidence is sparse.
- Some projects in that direction have been taking place already:
 - United States: Works Progress Administration 1935-1943
 - India: National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme since 2005
 - France: Territoires Zéro Chômeur de Longue Durée since 2017
 - Germany: Solidarisches Grundeinkommen in Berlin since 2020



Latent benefits of employment (Jahoda, 1933, 1981)

- 1. Collective purpose: Work as a source of meaning.
- 2. Social inclusion: Social interaction at work.
- 3. **Status:** Respect instead of social stigma.
- 4. Activity: Energy and involvement in life.
- 5. **Time structure:** Balance between work and spare time.
- 6. **Financial strain**: Income that allows for participation.

The Marienthal job guarantee pilot

Study design

Findings: Experimental comparison (preliminary)



- October 2020 April 2024 in Gramatneusiedl (Marienthal).
- Operated by AMS Niederösterreich (public employment service) and it.works (service provider).
- Budget: 7.4 Million Euro.
- All longtime unemployed (>12 months) are eligible.
- Preparatory training for up to 8 weeks.



- Voluntary participation.
 No sanctions for declining a job offer.
- 2. Collectively bargained wage (1.500€ / month for full-time).
- Meaningful employment taking into account personal constraints.

The Marienthal job guarantee pilot Training, job-search and support are integral features







Jobs are individually tailored. Options include:

- Jobs in a newly founded social enterprise (carpentry, renovation, gardening, support for elderly, ...).
- Some of these: Projects created by participants themselves (incl. planning a bike trail, book, topotheque).
- Subsidized jobs in the regular labor market.

Study design

Findings: Experimental comparison (preliminary)



- 1. Pairwise matching and staggered roll-out
- 2. Synthetic control comparison


Both parts of the design are pre-registered in the AEA RCT repository and approved by the Oxford Research Ethics Committee.


Participant characteristics



Dual study design II Location of Gramatneusiedl (Marienthal) and control municipalities



Study design

Findings: Experimental comparison (preliminary)

Findings - preliminary



- Pilot is in-progress until 2024.
- We conducted an in-depth survey among all participants in February 2021.
 - First wave started work in November/December 2020.
 - Second wave started work in March/April 2021.
- Index construction:
 - Sign each variable so that more is better.
 - Average all variables in each category.
 - Normalize index to range from 0 to 1.




Findings - preliminary



- 1. Higher incomes.
- 2. Better health and wellbeing.
- 3. Improvements in social inclusion, collective purpose, time structure.
- 4. Stable preferences.

Findings - preliminary Average outcomes in treatment and control group





Marienthal job guarantee pilot

Red dots are averages for Group 1, those already treated.
Blue dots are averages for Group 2, those who will be treated later.
Higher values imply better outcomes. Outcomes are scaled to have range 0 to 1.
