Important: a) Assessment, in cooperation with the ILO, of the obstacles identified and their impact on the realization of the principle; b) Awareness-raising and mobilization activities; c) Collection and analysis of data and information; d) Capacity building for the competent authorities; e) Guidance on the development of the national policy and plan of action; f) Basic social security guarantees; g) Promotion of fair migration policies; h) Vocational training, jobcreation and income-generation programmes for at-risk populations; and i) Promotion of freedom of association and collective bargaining to enable at-risk workers to join workers' organizations.
