Appointment by the Governing Body of a Commission of Inquiry in accordance with article 26(4) of the Constitution of the ILO

Composition of the Commission of Inquiry

- 1. At its present session, the Governing Body had before it a report of its Officers ¹ concerning the observance by Zimbabwe of the Freedom of Association and Protection of the Right to Organise Convention, 1948 (No. 87), and the Right to Organise and Collective Bargaining Convention, 1949 (No. 98). The Governing Body decided to refer the matter, without further discussion, to a Commission of Inquiry set up in accordance with article 26(4) of the Constitution.
- **2.** The Director-General proposes that the Commission of Inquiry be composed as follows:

Chairperson: Judge Raymond Ranjeva – Senior Judge at the International Court of

Justice, Conciliator at the World Bank International Centre for Settlement

of Investment Disputes.

Members: Mr Evance Rabban Kalula – Professor of Employment Law and Social

Security, Deputy Dean of Faculty of Law (Postgraduate Studies) and the Director of the Institute of Development and Labour Law of University of Cape Town; Chair of South African Employment Conditions
