ITC-ILO Labour Academy training course on Decent Work for Domestic Workers

Turin, Italy, 27-31 October 2014

The International Training Centre of the ILO organized an inter-regional open course on Decent Work for Domestic Workers. The course was conducted on 27-31 October 2014 in Turin, Italy, and included information and discussions on labour migration governance for domestic work.

The training programme on Decent Work for Domestic Workers was developed in light of the ILO Convention 189 and Recommendation 201 on domestic work, and has been receiving support of the EU funded Global Action Programme on Migrant Domestic Workers and their Families (GAP-MDW) in addressing the existing exclusion of domestic workers from social and labour rights. A special session on migrant domestic workers served an opportune time for the ILO to engage the participating countries to further discuss the agenda of the GAP-MDW and current situation of migrant domestic workers. With this regard, the GAP-MDW supported constituents from Indonesia to participate in a workshop on trafficking organized by the ASEAN TRIANGLE Project.

After the training, participants are able to explore policy and legislative issues and challenges regarding domestic work, master the relevant international legal instruments and mechanisms protecting domestic workers' rights, in particular the ILO Convention 189 and Recommendation 201, and learn from challenges faced internationally by other professionals working in the area, among other.
